1. How is Jesus being the Creator of all things significant? How has the world attacked this truth? What should believers do about this?
2. What is darkness? If one was living in darkness, what conclusions would we make about his/her life? How is Jesus “the Light”?
3. What do you think about John the Baptist? How was he a light-bearer? Should we be like him? How can we bear the light of Christ?
4. Why did you decide to receive the light? What are some excuses others give for not receiving the light?
5. We become children of God after we believe what He has done for us. What does being a Child of God mean to you?
6. How do we see God (v. 18)? How does this apply to the belief that we all have our own way to God?

John 1:1-18 ¹In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was in the beginning with God. ³All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made. ⁴In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. ⁵And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it.

⁶There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷This man came for a witness, to bear the witness of the Light, that all through him might believe. ⁸He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light. ⁹That was the true Light which gives light to every man coming into the world.

¹⁰He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him. ¹¹He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him. ¹²But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: ¹³who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.

¹⁴And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

¹⁵John bore witness of Him and cried out, saying, “This was He of whom I said, ‘He who comes after me is preferred before me, for He was before me.’”

¹⁶And of His fullness we have all received, and grace for grace.

¹⁷For the law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸No one has seen God at any time. The only begotten Son, Who is in the bosom of the Father, He has declared Him.

Read: John 1:19-34
