1. How does the world tend to view God?

2. What is the best source for learning about God?

3. Beholding God could have different impact on individuals. What sort of responses could such a command have (v. 9)?

4. Verse 11 describes God in the same fashion that Jesus does in John 10. Why should this picture be a comfort to us?

5. Verses 12-17 describe God's greatness. Discuss the various pictures of God and how they can bring comfort to us.

6. Verses 18-20 challenges the readers to consider the foolishness of idolatry. What things can become idols in our lives?

7. Verses 21-28 confront the readers with their possible ignorance. What things do you think people should know about God, but do not consider?

8. Have you seen the words of verses 29-31 in cards or on posters or plaques? Why do you think this passage would be popular?

9. How can we "wait on the Lord" (v.31)?

Theme: Behold Your God!

Monday

“Behold Your God!” (v. 9) Reflect upon God for seven minutes. Write down some things you observed about Him.

Tuesday

“He will feed His flock like a shepherd.” (v. 11) How has God been a shepherd to you? What things has He saved you from, and how has He fed you?

Wednesday

“...a drop in a bucket...” (v. 15) What is really huge for you, but just a small drop in a bucket to God? Consider His perspective. Observation: Take a 5-gal. bucket and put one drop of water in it. How intimidating is that drop?

Thursday

“Have you not known?” (v. 21) God has revealed Himself. What aspect of God have you been failing to focus upon? How has ignoring this truth affected life?

Friday

“He gives power to the weak” (v. 29) In what area do you feel weak? How can God help you in that area? Is there something that you need to do to gain that strength?

Saturday

“...mount up with wings like eagles...” (v. 31) Have your wings been clipped? Have you been high above the clouds? What tends to make the difference in your life?
